Walking Group

Our March walk was centred on Craig-y-nos and was eight miles and easy. Eight walkers turned out in unsettled



weather conditions. Our first climb took us above the snow line on Cribarth but the sun came out as we had a coffee stop before proceeding across the ridges with good views. Whilst walking towards Henrhyd Falls one of our walkers slipped on a rock whilst stepping up, fell and broke an arm. Whilst first aid was administered two walkers returned to the cars and brought two cars to evacuate the injured walker and the other seven back to Craig-y-nos before driving to hospital and our respective homes. The injured walker continues to make a good recovery.

Clydach Gorge near Abergavenny was the location for our

April walk. We decided to include this walk early in the year before the dual-ling of the A465 (an engineering challenge in itself) started degradation of this beautiful wooded valley. The six walkers wandered around the 19th century ruins of the iron works and lime works walking up the tramway to cross a stunning railway viaduct above the fast tumbling river at the head of the wooded valley. After a bit more climbing it was a contour walk past disused limestone quarries around to another valley where we descended to cross meadows (with some muddy patches) to the banks of the Monmouth and Brecon canal. Interestingly we walked under the canal on two occasions, before walking up the beautiful wooded Clydach valley alongside the river to the car park.

The May walk was scheduled to be a ten mile walk from Llangynidr around Tor Y Foel but unfortunately the weather was not playing ball and we had to cancel the evening before. However, we plan to insert the walk in the 2016 programme.

Friendship

Volunteer activity:

Since the first trip carried out by a volunteer on 4th February this year, to-date we have completed 19 trips to and from either the Heath or Llandough hospitals.

Our 20th trip is booked for 8th June and is a return trip to the Heath. On this trip I plan to test the Heath Parking Permit (see below).

For reasons of data protection I have not included names or reasons for the trips.

We currently have 12 volunteers and as yet have not missed a requested trip, however, it has been close at times due to non-availability of volunteers. We had a small amount of interest for new volunteers following the appeal in the DCRA newsletter and membership subscription form towards the end of last year, but in the end no new volunteers were signed up. There is also a need for a Friendship Group Coordinator. For this position it is not necessary to undergo the DBS security checks that trip volunteers have to unless the person wants to be a trip volunteer as well. The tasks involve taking the calls from members in need, validating the need, entering details in a call database and liaising with volunteers to find someone to carryout the trip etc. The position requires someone with good telephone and email communication skills. If anyone is interested in this position, please contact me on the number above.

Heath Parking Permit:

Linda Pritchard from the Glamorgan Voluntary Services (GVS), formally the Vale Centre for Voluntary Services (VCVS), which DCRA is a member of, has been working with the Heath Health Board and the Company that runs the car parking services at the Heath (Vinci) to get free parking for volunteers. This effort has taken about a year to sort out, but we have now been sent our permits. Unfortunately, the expiry date on the permits has already passed, but I've been told by Linda that this will not be a problem and new ones will be issued at a later date. The process involves parking in 20 minute drop-off bays and then contacting VINCI to let them know that a car is being left there. I want to test the process before handing out the permits to the other volunteers, as mentioned above

I plan to do this on 8th June. If successful, I will arrange a volunteer meeting to go over the process and issue the permits.

Care and Repair in the Vale:

At the last meeting (2nd March), it was mentioned that more details of the above service would be obtained. A

leaflet of the services provided is available for those attending the meeting, but in brief, from the leaflet, the services provide are:

- Care & Repair in the Vale offers a free advice service for older homeowners in the Vale of Glamorgan and is tailored to individual needs.
- They support older people to repair, adapt and maintain their homes, enabling them to live as independently as possible with increased safety, security, warmth and comfort.
- They help people with work ranging from small items such as the installation of handrails to major jobs such as bathroom adaptations or replacing a roof.
- They do things such as:
 - o Visit you at your home to discuss your concerns.
 - o Provide telephone advice and details of reputable contractors.
 - o Offer impartial advice on general repairs and home safety.
 - o Assist with obtaining and evaluating no obligation quotations.
 - o Discuss and assist with applying for grants to finance works, if eligible.
 - o Oversee the work carried out.
 - o Provide advice on the prevention of falls.
 - o Provide advice on the energy efficiency and heating of your home.
 - o Provide welfare benefits advice and support.
