AOB

We had a wonderful talk by air ambulance Wales given by Katherine and Anne. They described the work they do and a brief history of the service which has helicopters across wales including on in Cardiff, the children's wales air ambulance. The welsh service is considered a platinum level service and the model used here is being copied across the world. There are 4 locations in wales that have helicopters, Swansea, Caernarfon, Welshpool and Cardiff with state-of-the-art equipment in each. The helicopters are a medical emergency service taking A&E to the patients rather than just flying them to A&E. The Cardiff Childrens Welsh ambulance is a planned service specifically for the transfer of children and has a state-of-the-art incubator for small babies. With the 3 emergency helicopters it means that they can be flown to emergencies within 20 minutes anywhere in Wales. It cost £5.5million to buy and equip a helicopter so the service leases the helicopters. There is a pilot, critical care practitioner and a consultant on all flights. The cost of running the service is £6.5million per year, £125,000 per week or £18,000 per day. This means they rely on fundraising for the service to continue. There are WWA shops around wales and one in Churchill way Cardiff opening soon. They will send a van to collect items and will accept electrical items too. They run a life saving lottery and attend shows such as the royal Welsh and at present have 650 volunteers. For more information go to

In March we stayed low and local hoping to avoid any bad weather usually experienced on the hills at this time of year. Fourteen walkers enjoyed an 8 mile moderate walk on the Gower in April, starting in Llanmadoc and making for Cwm Ivy and the Wales Coast Path across Broughton Burrows and past Blue pool before dropping down on the beach at Spaniard Point. Most walked across the causeway to the small islet of Burry Holmes which was duly explored by 'marauding pirates'. Returning to the mainland the group walked around the bottom of Llanmadoc Hill with increased enthusiasm and hunger towards The Kings Head at Llangennith for lunch. The route back to Llanmadoc took us up and over Llanmadoc Hill and back to our cars. A great walk proposed by Robin. We had sun!

One of our past frequent walker and a founder member, Peter Clark, emigrated to England a while back, but invited us to walk with him and his wife Barbara in the Cotswolds. Eight walkers assembled at Stanton for an 8 mile triangular walk to Stanway and Snowshill, where we had lunch outside the Snowshill Arms, before returning to Stanton. Three very pretty Cotswold villages and great country walking was enjoyed by all. It was good to nurture the friendship with Peter and Barbara.

We travelled east to Longtown, north of Abergavenny for our May walk. Starting at Longtown, we walked up the Olchon Valley over many stiles and crossed the river Monnow (that flows through Monmouth) before climbing up onto Offa's Dyke for a splendid ridge walk with superb views. We extended the ridge walk as it was so good and descended down a grassy track and across the fields back to Longtown. Nine walkers enjoyed this 11 mile, moderate to challenging walk in good weather.

In June 14 members will be travelling to Lake Bled, Slovenia for a week's walking holiday. Really looking forward to it as it offers fantastic walking and scenery.
