DOW CORNING RETIREE'S ASSOCIATION WALKING GROUP REPORT TO 8th JUNE 2021 MEETING MEETING

The last report submitted was in March 2020 just before the first of the multiple Covid pandemic lockdowns in Wales with subsequent stringent multi-household meeting restrictions. However during the intermediary periods when restrictions had been lifted to allow large group outdoor activities the DCRAWG has taken the opportunity to meet up, take a walk, enjoy the fresh air, the wonderful Welsh countryside and each other's company – a real tonic! During the past 15 months we have been able to undertake only five walks and trying to recall them for this report seems quite strange and the walks such a long time ago.

After the first shut down restrictions were lifted we had a "warm-up walk" in late July when 14 avid walkers turned up for a 5 mile walk from Fforest Fawr around Craig yr Allt and back. This proved to be excellent preparation for our August walk of almost 10 miles in the Wolvesnewton area when 18 walkers, led by Paul Hodges explored a valley area not known to many but offering superb views and good paths (sometimes) together with some formidable/difficult stiles to get over on the way.

Our September walk took us back to Llanthony Priory area for a 12 mile, challenging walk up onto one ridge for some great ridge walking only to have to descend into and cross the valley floor to climb up a second ridge and walk back with superb views on either side to a turn off point above Llanthony Priory set out picturesquely below. It is interesting that whilst some of the walkers struggle climbing uphill, others really suffer going down hill (usually sore knees), whilst the lucky one do not suffer at all! 10 walkers came on this outing.

After the 'firebreak' lockdown we managed to get a walk in for December, staying close to home and daring to challenge the high ranging tides of the Bristol Channel by doing a short walk along the Wales Coast Path, returning to Swanbridge by walking along the rocky shoreline before crossing over the causeway to walk around Sully Island. We returned to the mainland without getting wet feet but managed to wet our whistles sat outside the Captains Wife having a Christmas drink. Unfortunately a food menu was not available to allow us to enjoy our traditional Christmas Lunch together.

We had to wait until May 2021 before we could meet up again when Robin took 12 walkers on a National Trust 8 mile Bluebell ramble around the Clytha area, passed castles, stately homes, ploughed fields, churches, woods and along great long stretches of the River Usk.

Bath was the location for our June walk when 11 walkers turned out for a delightful 8 mile walk starting from Bath Spa railway station, walking initially along the River Avon, then the Kennet and Avon canal with it's locks and bridges before striking uphill to the start of the 6 mile moderate Bath Skyline walk with some good views over Bath and a number of points of interest around the well waymarked circular walk. The weather was sunny and warm with a shower as we were finishing lunch in the Woodland Path play area, A good day out in good company. Unfortunately we could not find a place for a beer at the end of the walk.
