The UK for the last few years is being hit by extreme weather e.g. flooding etc. Below are just a few tips passed on to me as secretary to share with you. They may be worth jotting down and keeping safe if your property is vulnerable. If a flooding is imminent, it is vitally important to act swiftly to protect your property and mitigate damage.

Unplug electrical items and sensitive equipment and store on upper floors

Turn off gas, electricity and water mains.

Move vehicles if you can to higher ground

Place important documentation and photographs in watertight container and move to upper floors

If you own a mobile phone with a camera, and if possible take photographs of your property to assist in the event of a claim

Do not attempt to walk or drive through flooded roadways or cross streams etc.

If water rises in your home before you evacuate, move to the top floor

If you own a battery-operated radio, listen for the latest local storm information

If you have come in contact with floodwaters, wash your hands with soap and disinfected water

In September nine members assembled at Skenfrith Castle to undertake a tough 12 mile walk in humid conditions up to Grosmont Castle, where a well-earned lunch was taken within the castle walls. The return route circumnavigated Edmunds Tump along the scenic Blackbrook Valley back to Skenfrith, where thirsts were quenched in the Bell Inn garden in warm sunshine. A pretty walk.

As the walking group is now in its 14th year, it is inevitable that we repeat some walks, especially at member's request. The October walk was a repeat, the 8 mile walk started at Llanthony Priory and followed down the Eywas valley to Cwmyoy church before climbing up onto Hatterrall Hill and Offa's Dyke. The views from the ridge were stupendous, looking across the Welsh and English countryside, The descent obliquely along the shoulder of the hill portrayed Llanthony Priory in the sunshine before us. Stunning and memorable for the seven walkers.

It was down to the Gower for the November walk based on Penmaen, Cefn Bryn, Penrice and Reynoldston, to make a very pleasant walk of eight miles. The weather was kind with a cold northerly breeze as the seven walkers walked over Cefn Bryn, but warm sunshine as we ate our lunch outside Penrice church with fabulous views over Oxwich Bay. Another repeat, but last done in 2004. Was it really that long ago?
